A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, during the month of November we recognize and celebrate the family members of activeduty soldiers and the sacrifices they have made in support of our nation's heroes;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim November, 2021, as "NATIONAL VETERAN AND MILITARY FAMILIES' MONTH" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
