There are some practical things we can all do to prevent the spread of any respiratory illness, such as cold or flu:

- 5. Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw it away.




A visualization of the Corona virus as it appearance under a microscope.

Every 10 years, the federal government gets a chance to count the number of people who make up the population of the United States. The census aims to count the entire population of the country, and at the location where each person usually lives.

The census asks questions of people in homes and group living situations, including; how many people live or stay in each home, and the sex, age and race of each person. The goal is to count everyone once, only once, and in the right place.

The Census is important because when you respond to the census, you help your community gets its fair share of the more than \$675 billion per year in federal funds spent on schools, hospitals, roads, public works and other vital programs.
