## MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE STEERING GROUP, MAY 6, 2014

9:10 Chairman Martin called the meeting to order and provided welcoming and introductory remarks.

<u>Administrative Updates</u>: Administrative updates were supplied by MajGen Cornell Wilson (USMC RET) as follows:

- Date and location of meeting of the Full Military Affairs Commission announced
- Addition of staff member to Military Affairs office through NC National Guard announced
- Undertaking by Military Affairs to procure upgraded conferencing equipment announced
- Details of Military Appreciation Day event sponsored by NC Bankers Association on May 20, 2014, announced
- Meeting of the Commanders' Council on May 20, 2014, announced and logistics for the day discussed
- Announcement of May 14, 2014, as starting date for the meeting of General Assembly
- Governor's announcement of in-state tuition for military
- Major Lumsden of the Military Affairs office briefed on the criteria for the tuition grant, stating that there is a floor of \$7,500 for one year only for qualified applicants, and requirement to establish residency at enrollment. He added that the SEAA is assuming oversight of the residency definition.

Budget Update: This was reviewed by the Committee. The budget expenditures are below \$100,000. One travel claim is pending.

## **COMMITTEE UPDATES**

• General Dordal handed out a top-ten list of priorities and emphasized that Community Coordinators are to meet with installation commanders prior to sub-committee

meetings. General Dordal asked each of the Committee Chairs to provide their top three priorities to Major Lumsden in advance of the Full Commission meeting.

**Quality of Life:** LTC Robert Anderson briefed on the Quality of Life Committee topics as follows:

- The topic of education was discussed at the last meeting
- Safety and traffic on Fort Bragg roads will be a Department of Transportation issue
- The morale support project has been allowed to dissolve
- Fort Bragg installation Commander wants gas tax money to be used for road repair
- Darryl Black commented that the State is willing to fix roads that get to the gate of the base
- LTC Anderson added that Col. Sanborn was to provide a list of failed intersections to give to NC DOT
- Gen. Dordal added that public-public, public-private relationships is a means of getting the roads fixed
- Can earmarked funds from federal gas tax be lobbied for road repair on bases through our federal liaison, since the military falls under federal jurisdiction?
- Transportation Commission discussed personally visiting installations through Col. Sanborn. Sebastian Montagne of the DOT is prepared to set up this visit
- 911 & cable proceeds, each\$100K. Since the base was annexed, the money from taxes went to the City of Fayetteville. Fort Bragg wants a joint 911 center for Fayetteville, Fort Bragg and Cumberland County.
- More communication between Community Coordinators and base commanders is needed
- Gen. McKissock added that a community coalition of mayors and political leadership from Fayetteville, Jacksonville and Cherry Point is being formed, and they will be able to add to issues related to quality of life

**Legislative Affairs:** Darryl Black provided illustrative hand-outs, briefed on legislative topics and draft bills on behalf of Senator Brown.

- In-state tuition bill the General Assembly is considering the UNC Board of Governors' version, however, the Governor/Commission and the UNC Board of Governors need to craft a unified version
- Selection of Adjutant General bill
- Credit for military training bill
- BRAC Shield bill
- Modified HB 433 (Tall Structures bill) and development of zoning map
- National Guard is lobbying for a monthly increase to pension of \$20 to be factored against interest on \$95M in the Guard's account
- Military children identifier Darryl Black is preparing a list of military children in schools by county

**Economic Development:** Chairman Gary McKissock presented on topics and observations before the Economic Development Committee, to date.

- Recommends a spouse employment plan to facilitate retention ( a spouse's desire to remain in NC has influence)
- The State must increase its connection with a society of human resource managers, like SHRM
- Recommend having Jacksonville Human Resources Manager, Kimberly Lindsay, address the Commission to brief on hiring military from the perspective of human resources
- Objective is to convince the human resource community that they should be going after qualified employees with a military background
- Darryl Black added that the Commission should familiarize itself with NCWORKS.GOV, the central State employment website
- One centralized portal is ideal for the purpose of tracking metrics
- Working Group on Veterans, Service members and Their Families is an opportunity for State to leverage all resources on an interagency basis
- Recommend that on the Governor's next visit to DC, he meet with General Shinseki at the VA
- Recommend that the Governor prepare short video presentations to promote veteran employment and endorsement of a website

# **Base Sustainability and Community Affairs: (From Committee Meeting Minutes in Mr. Roberts' absence)**

- Hoffman Forest
- Fort Bragg mitigated area for environmental concerns, i.e., RCW, long leaf pine
- Active role in map of active airspace and areas around installations that need to be protected, led by Darryl Black
- Bear Gardens
- Wind Energy/Tall Structures
- Annual Firefighter Certification
- Roads/Intersections
