John had meeting and was informed Navy not supporting the Lift Fan facility. Is stressing that the NCMAC weigh in on the impact to the F-35 fleet and the sales overseas. The risk of only one OEM facility is great. The delegation is ready to sign a letter to the Pentagon for a November 9th release.

Sal stated there is momentum on the comm plan subcommittee. Lacy and Joe recommend a conference call to redirect plan to the four audiences and the products required for each audience. General public and logo/brand development is recommended. Discussion held about a way ahead for comm plan.

11:10 **Committee Updates:**

Quality of Life: Gave update on Crisis center.

Veterans courts update: in many situations, the case load isn't there for the dollars expended. This may be a better initiative for the Veterans Affairs division to consider.

Occupational licensing: Came up with several occupations that may be worth pursuing. Sally-Ann stated that Sen. Wells is looking into introducing legislation to make obtaining in-state licenses. He is looking for anecdotal stories by Servicemember spouses.

- Sentinel Landscapes: Successful so far. 38 counties identified. Funding concern if other services do not lend support. NCMAC is supporting with \$150K. A budget line with DMVA is proposed to continue support.

• Discuss the Process: Bob stated bullets will be given to highlight work on priorities. Paul reitierated that the actions will be for the subcommittees and the actions will be updated and monitored by the VC.

Committee Structure Recommendation Communication Subcommittee Update: See above Wind Energy Bill

FY 17-18 Budget Update: Chair provided update about what was submitted. Budget explained during 3rd Quarter NCMAC meeting was used by DMVA to present to the Governor. A discussion was held about how to present the possible money that NC would offer to build the Vertical Lift Facility. The recommendation of the NCMAC is to ask \$5-10 million of state funds for the building. Joe gave the brief on the budget proposal for the DMVA. Specification for requests are vital to ask more money.

Police training reduction: Frank explained a possible initiative to acknowledge policing experience, especially MPs, by the military for civilian training exemptions. Chair agrees to have it be a topic at NCMAC to pursue background research with local law enforcement and DPS.

Chair presented a restructuring of the NCMAC subcommittees to include the exofficios or their designees. Suggestions by ESG were discussed.
