PHOTOS AVAILABLE: Sec. Gaskin honors U.S. Coast Guard with proclamation

The ceremony was part of the annual Coast Guard Day event at Base Elizabeth City. Elizabeth City was officially re-certified as a Coast Guard City at the USCG Day Ceremony.

On Wednesday, to celebrate Coast Guard Birthday, Secretary Gaskin visited Coast Guard Base Elizabeth City to present Rear Admiral Laura M. Dickey, Commander of Coast Guard District 5 with Governor Cooper's proclamation, which the Governor issued in honor of the United States Coast Guard's 231st birthday. As part of the event a brief ceremony was held to recertify Elizabeth City as a "Coast Guard City." The city first received the Coast Guard City designation from the Coast Guard in May 2015. Under the program's rules, cities are required to seek recertification every five years. To date, 29 cities have been declared by Congress to be "Coast Guard Cities."

New measures to protect state employees and the public at state facilities

Governor Cooper recently announced Executive Order 224 as part of the state's stepped-up efforts to control the steady and significant increase of COVID-19 across North Carolina. The Order puts into place new measures to protect state employees and members of the public at state offices, buildings, and facilities. Executive Order 224 applies to all Cabinet agencies and non-Cabinet agencies are strongly encouraged to participate. Starting on Monday, August 2, changes will begin at state facilities to protect the health and safety of state employees and visitors. Accurate and regularly updated information about COVID-19 vaccines and testing is available at YourSpotYourShot.nc.gov.

Veterans Service Centers Reopen to General Public

After more than 15 months, all 12 Veteran Service Centers across North Carolina reopened for public contact on July 1st! Veterans may now schedule in person appointments and offices may accept walk-in traffic. Personnel will continue to exercise good personal protective practices with sneeze guards installed at every person's work station and disinfecting hand wash stations across facilities. These safe practices continue with the wearing of masks, face shields, and gloves for anyone who has an in-office visit and wishes to glove up. 
NC Women Milvets Summit

State Veterans Cemeteries update COVID-19 guidance

The Department will revisit changes to operations as Governor Cooper's Road to Recovery Plan updates.

Cemeteries

Interments are offered the option of a committal service at the time of interment. Military funeral honors, customarily provided by the Department of Defense and volunteer honor guards will be based on local availability. Listed below are guidelines to follow until further notice.

- Services are 30 minutes, Monday – Friday, at 10am, 12pm, 2pm. Family and attendees must exit the cemetery at the conclusion of the service at half past the hour.
- Caskets & urns must be thoroughly disinfected before entering the cemetery.
- There is no limit on the number of attendees at a committal service.
- Cemetery chairs or podium will not be placed at the committal area.
- Next of Kin information will be given to funeral staff.
- Attendees aren't permitted to handle or touch caskets or urns before, during or after the service.
- Attendees who are not vaccinated should wear a mask and maintain distance when they cannot maintain six feet of distance.
- Funeral flower arrangements are not permitted to be left during the committal

service, but, families or funeral staff may place one arrangement on the gravesite after all services for the day have concluded.
